

### **Rt. 50 - Washington Street Project: The Next Two Weeks:**

A&M Concrete has set up the permanent lane closure - the block of Plains Road & Pendleton Street for about 6 weeks performing the concrete, and brick work needing to get done to the pavers, as well as installing sewer lines and structures in pre identified areas. They will also have a small maintenance crew performing patch work between Madison & Jay Street.

The Waterline Sub Contractor is prepared to perform a tie in for a fire hydrant on Thursday night at the intersection of Pendleton & Route 50. This will be occurring on Thursday Night if lane closure request gets approved. Once Tie in is approved, they will continue on with their 2" connections and asphalt restoration.

Conduit Crews will be on site here within the next couple of days to begin their work for the light poles.

Thank you to all for your patience during the construction. Those of you who are using Federal Street, Stonewall Avenue and Marshall Streets to avoid the traffic lights - please be aware of pedestrians, children riding bicycles, people walking dogs, and obey the speed limits, even go a little slower.

Here are a few pictures of the lights on main street - thank you Lloyd Ferguson for taking the pictures. Please obey all traffic signs and there is no parking between the barrels.






