TOWN COUNCIL STRATEGIC PLAN - 2023

The Town Council met on March 6th at The Hill School to discuss its strategic priorities for 2023. The discussion centered on three main areas:

- Protecting established neighborhoods with additional zoning regulations: The Town has heard from residents concerned by the scale of new homes built in the Ridgeview neighborhood; the Town Council has already adopted a number of restrictions and will be considering additional regulations to protect the character of the neighborhood.
- Infrastructure Needs, focused on South Madison Street: The Town Council spent time discussing the need to conduct a comprehensive review of South Madison Street, to improve commercial vitality and safety. Examples include enhancing visibility, adding more infrastructure, and repairing the sidewalks.
- Engage the community regarding Asbury Church: In the fall of 2022, the Town Council decided to retain the historic Asbury Church and invest the time and dollars to restore and reuse the Church for community purposes. The Town Council is ready to initiate this process and has made it a strategic priority.

What's Happening With the Town Hall Project?




The Town's general contractor has once again provided the Town notice that it will be delayed in delivering the new Town Hall. The anticipated move-in date for Town staff is now May/June 2023.

The Town Council has heard from some members of the public concerned about what these delays mean in terms of cost. The Town has a fixed-price contract that requires the project to be delivered at the contractual cost, regardless of time delays. In addition, the contract calls for the contractor to pay the Town set amounts per day of delay, which the Town will assess at the completion of the project.

The Town staff and Town Council are working closely with our construction management team to ensure the Town's interests are fully protected and that the project is completed according to design.

Despite these setbacks, progress continues to be made on the project:

- Permeable pavers have been laid in the two main parking areas;
- The retaining walls are complete;
- Interior drywall is nearly complete and most trade activities are nearing completion;
- Grading of the Village Green continues;
- Upcoming work includes: resolving trim issues on the windows to meet design specs; installing the exterior EIFS (stucco-like facade); finishing the driveway and asphalt; laying sidewalks and other concrete; installing floors and millwork; connecting permanent power; and fabricating the cupola.





PROPOSED FISCAL YEAR 2024 BUDGET



The Town Manager presented his proposed budget for fiscal year 2024 (FY24) on February 23, 2023. The Town continues to see increases in tax revenues, primarily from the Meals Tax and Transient Occupancy Tax (sometimes called the "lodging tax"). The Town is also realizing significant interest income from its investments.

Property assessments, conducted by Loudoun County, have resulted in property values increasing 12% for 2023. The Town Council has already decided to lower the real property tax rate. A Public Hearing will be held on March 23rd at 6:00pm at the Town Office to hear from the public on the

proposed tax rate.

Proposed expenditures in the Town budget are intended to accomplish the Town Council's strategic goals and to continue operating the Town government in an effective and efficient manner. Enhancements include safety items in the Police Department, technology improvements, and community-focused events for residents.

In the Utility Fund, the Town Manager has recommended 3% rate increases for both water and sewer service, in accordance with the Utility Rate Model conducted last year. The Town Council has expressed a desire to review current rates and to discuss how to help low-income residents with utility bills.

The Town continues to invest in infrastructure, primarily in the area of repairing aging sewer lines and replacing old water mains that are susceptible to breaks.

Public input is accepted at all Town Council meetings, as well as at specific public hearings that are required by state code. Input can also be provided by calling the Town Office, emailing the Town Council/Town Clerk, or submitting a public comment on the Town's website.
