WATER CONSERVATION PROPOSED ORDINANCE CHANGES

The Town of Middleburg continues to experience drought conditions, much like our entire region. Unless the Town sees significant rainfall over the coming months, it is likely that the Town will need to impose water conservation measures during the summer of 2025.

Last year, the Town heard from many citizens who felt that the water conservation measures were not clear or effective in balancing the needs of homeowners and the need to protect the Town's water supply.

In response, the Town is proposing changes to the Town Code that would recognize more effective means to lower water usage while maintaining the ability for residents to keep their landscaping healthy.

The Town will be hosting a **community meeting on Tuesday, May 20th, at 6pm at the Town Hall (10 W. Marshall Street)** to review the proposed changes to the water conservation ordinance. Proposed measures include:

- Voluntary Conservation: Encouraging careful use of water and requesting that customers limit their outdoor use of water.
- Mandatory Conservation: Prohibiting outdoor watering during daytime hours and prohibiting the use of sprinklers/irrigation systems.
- Water Rationing: Complete prohibition on outdoor use of water, and instituting surcharge rates on those who exceed a certain threshold of water use.

HOW TO CONSERVE WATER

Water conservation is a responsibility that all of us take seriously. The Town encourages residents to consider actions to conserve water - not only does it protect our water sources, it also saves you money!!

- Purchase a rain barrel to capture rain water and use it for watering your plants and landscaping. The Town is investigating options to get discounts on rain barrels for residents; stay tuned!
- Water outdoor landscaping during the early morning or late evening hours, when the water is less likely to evaporate. This will make your watering more effective.
- Remember to turn off faucets when brushing teeth, doing dishes, or other chores. And consider shorter showers or baths to limit water use.
- Check your appliances/equipment for leaks. We have had a number of customers with water softeners or water filtration systems that have been stuck in an "open" mode, using tens of thousands of gallons of water. This becomes very expensive for customers and also wastes a significant amount of water. Consider having these kinds of appliances checked to ensure they are operating properly!

We all have a role to play in saving water - we appreciate your help!



INTERESTED IN RUNNING FOR COUNCIL?

Mayoral and Councilmember elections are held in November of each odd year, and successful candidates take office on January 1st of the following year.

The term of the Mayor is for two years, and the terms of Councilmembers are for four years. Candidates interested in running for public office must meet certain qualifications and are required to file specific documents in order to appear on the ballot.

The event includes food, ice cream, drinks, music, and - of course - FIREWORKS!


Kick-off the day with FREE SWIM at the Community Center from 4-6pm. Free face painting as well!

PUBLIC SAFETY TIP OF THE MONTH:

BICYCLE AND VEHICLE SAFETY

Ride Smart, Stay Safe, Be Seen - As we enter the warmer months, we are likely to see more bicyclists riding in and around Town.

If you are cycling, choose safe roads, ride carefully, and ensure visibility.

Windy and curvy roads make it hard to see cyclists, so use caution!

Share the Road - In the same way, it is a driver's responsibility to share the road and use caution around bikes.

Take it easy on narrow, curvy roads. Watch for cyclists, and give the required 3 feet of separation for safety!
